1. Before entering, refer to General Information, Livestock Rules and Regulations, Youth Rules and Market Stock rules.
2. Animals to arrive on the grounds between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. and be weighed Mon., 8/18.
3. LIMIT: Seven goats per exhibitor
4. Benton and Franklin county 4-H exhibitors will have first priority for available space.
5. Market breed showmanship class will take place Tue., 8/19, at 9 a.m. Market wether judging to follow. Breed doe will follow market wether judging. Novelty breed showmanship class will take place Tue., 8/19, at 11 a.m. Novelty breed classes to follow.
6. Breeding dairy doe showmanship classes will take place at 9 a.m. Wed, 8/20. Breeding dairy goat classes to follow.
7. You must use your own animal in showmanship classes.
8. White shirt, black pants preferred. All clothing must be neat and clean. (See dress code, page 19.)
9. All exhibitors are encouraged to enter the costume parade.
10. All clubs/chapters must have an educational display.
11. All grains must be kept in tightly sealed containers.
12. No horns allowed on any animal showing.

FITTING AND SHOWING

All 4-H and FFA exhibitors must enter and exhibit in Fitting and Showing to receive any premium points. Be sure to mark **ONLY ONE** Fitting and Showing on entry form or it will be returned. Chain collars are proper for showmanship. Animals are to be your best trained and must be at least 4 months old. Overall Champion will go to the Round Robin.

LOT NUMBER

1. Novice, Junior Division, first time to show any animal at any fair.
2. Junior
3. Intermediate
4. Senior
5. FFA, must have been enrolled in project year prior to fair.

MARKET GOATS

Entries are limited to 4-H and FFA members living in or attending school in Benton or Franklin counties or the Burbank School District.

MARKET GOAT CLASS & SALE RULES

1. Only one wether or doe goat per exhibitor. No horns.
2. Does or wethers must be of dairy or meat breed. No pygmy or angora.
3. All animals must have been born after 11/01/07 and owned by exhibitor no later than 05/01/08.
4. All animals are required to be weighed and tagged on 05/17/08 along with sheep and swine. A back-up animal is allowed, but only one animal will be permitted to be displayed, shown and sold at the fair.
5. Animals will be judged in weight classes.
6. Weight limit: All animals must weigh between 65 and 125 pounds. Under and over weight animals will be sent home.
7. White ribbon animals will not be eligible to sell.
8. All animals selling will pay up to 3 percent fee to cover costs incurred by the sale committee. In addition, a \$2 fee will be charged for pictures.

PEE WEE SHOWMANSHIP

Contact the Superintendent to enter. Children must be 8 years old or younger. Animals must already be entered in either open

class or 4-H and must be on the grounds. Contest date and time will be posted. NOTE: Ribbon only.

DAIRY GOATS

Dairy goats entered in these classes are not required to be registered. Each doe should be entered in the breed type that she most closely resembles. Contact the Superintendent for assistance.
