D. Flowers, houseplant and arrangements

LOT NUMBER

1. Annual flowers, five entries allowed
2. Perennial flowers, five entries allowed
3. Dahlias, five entries allowed
4. Flowering plant, potted
5. Foliage plant, potted
6. Single cacti or succulent, potted
7. Collection of five or more cacti or succulent, potted
8. Dish gardens, under 10" high or five or more different varieties of houseplants
9. Fresh flower arrangement, line design
10. Fresh flower arrangement, mass design
11. Miniature fresh flower arrangement
12. Miniature dried flower arrangement
13. Flower arrangement with dried plant materials

14. Fresh and/or dried corsage (no artificial flowers or plants)
15. Terrarium, depicting a woodland, desert or imaginary scene, not exceeding 24" in length or 12" in height. Three or more different plants must be used.
16. Table top garden: a dish garden depicting a woodland, desert or imaginary scene, not exceeding 15" in diameter or 4" in height. Three or more different plants must be used.
