1. Before entering, see General Information.
2. All booths must be completed by 10 p.m. Mon., 8/18. Booths to be removed between 8 and 10 a.m. Sun., 8/24.
3. Booths are agricultural exhibits and should consist of agricultural products and produce; non-agricultural materials should be held to an absolute minimum. Individual items in the booth should be representative of the principal products of the farm and/or homes in the community. Novelties or oddities should be held to a minimum unless they are used to show some special use.
4. No minimum or maximum number vegetables and root crops.
5. Livestock products: Eggs, wool, honey, cured meats, etc. Fresh milk sours and detracts from the exhibit.
6. General: Empty cartons and containers should not be used. Canned goods should be in standard uniform containers
7. The dyeing of any produce will be held to a minimum; excessive use will be penalized. Sprays or waxes for preservation of produce will be allowed if not done in excess.
8. Avoid using any materials which will wilt or otherwise lose their attractiveness.
9. Name of grange shall not appear in booth. Names will be displayed by Superintendent on booth after judging.
10. No steps shall be used in front of booth.
11. Animation must operate four out of five days to qualify.
12. No commercial foods may be used in the booths.
 - Decorations or materials placed alongside walls of booths should be no higher than the existing wall. False ceilings and decorations or mobiles above booth spaces are prohibited.
 - No produce or materials are to be placed on the floor in front of the booth. The back walls of the booths shall be four feet high. The words of the theme shall appear on the background. For educational value, items should be labeled.
 - Judging will be done Tue., 8/19, so that all displays may be judged at their best. Three judges will be appointed to judge the displays. Judges will submit their scorecards to the head superintendent for final summary.

SCHEDULE OF AWARDS

Pomona booths and Subordinate booths shall be awarded ribbons for first through seventh places. In addition, one "Special" ribbon shall be awarded among the adult grange booths. A ribbon will be awarded among adult grange booths for the best use of animation depicting the fair theme as it relates to agriculture.

2. Space allotted per exhibit will be 2' x 8' or 8' x 8' (depending on availability). This class is open to all junior grange exhibitors age 5-14 yrs.
3. Each junior grange shall be awarded first through fifth place ribbons.
4. Each booth or table display shall include a cross-section of the achievements of that group.
